



## ECHO Autism: Transition to Adulthood

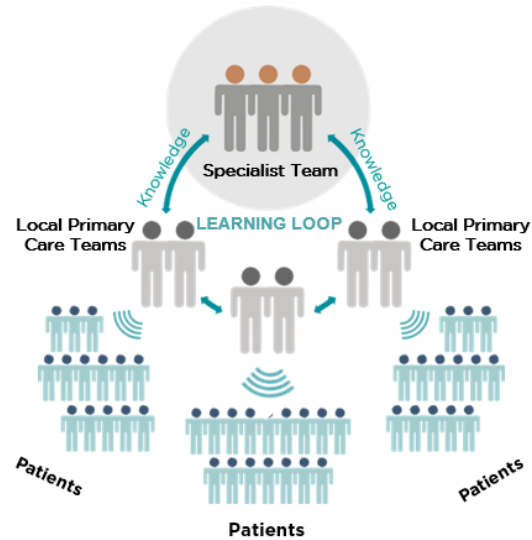
